Social Emotional Skills

Perhaps you have noticed that you have an extra shadow now. Children take their cues from the grown-ups around them by mimicking their behaviors, words or actions. At this age your child is learning about the world through observation. Copying you is an act of bonding and by imitating your behavior, she has an immediate empathetic response. Imitation is also a cornerstone of language development. She is using imitation to learn social emotional language and skills.

Tips to Connect

Imitation will often occur as you're doing tasks around the house. Your child will want to get in on the action. Try to carve out some of the task for her to tackle.
